Tony Stevens appeals from the order of the Craighead County Circuit Court revoking his suspended imposition of sentence (SIS). We affirm the revocation. This is a companion case to two other cases, also handed down today.

In 2017, Stevens pleaded guilty to possession of less than two grams of methamphetamine, a Class D felony, and being a habitual offender. For this plea, Stevens received eighteen months in the Arkansas Division of Correction and five years' SIS.

In April 2022, the State filed a petition for revocation followed by two supplemental petitions alleging that Stevens had violated the conditions of his SIS by committing the new offenses of possession of a controlled substance, possession of drug paraphernalia, and failure to register as a sex offender. The petitions filed in this case also alleged that Stevens

had violated his SIS in two other cases, and a joint revocation hearing was held for all three cases; thus, the evidence and the circuit court's decision was the same in all three cases. On appeal, Stevens has filed identical briefs in all three cases. For the reasons stated in *Stevens v. State*, 2024 Ark. App. 95, we affirm the revocation in this case.

Affirmed.
