CRIMINAL PROCEDURE — MOTION FOR RULE ON CLERK — AFFIDAVIT BY ATTORNEY ADMITTING MISTAKE ON HIS PART IN LATE TENDER OF RECORD — GOOD CAUSE FOR GRANTING MOTION. — An affidavit by an attorney for a criminal defendant attached to a motion for rule on the clerk admitting that the record was tendered late due to a mistake on the attorney's part is good cause to grant the motion.

PER CURIAM. Appellant William Terry, by his attorney, has again filed for a rule on the clerk. In a per curiam opinion issued March 16, 1981, we denied a similar motion. His attorney, E.
