APPEAL & ERROR — FAILURE TO TIMELY FILE RECORD — WHEN MOTION FOR RULE ON THE CLERK WILL BE GRANTED. — If an attorney for a criminal defendant will concede that it was his fault that the record was not timely filed, or if other good cause is shown, a motion for rule on the clerk will be granted.
