CRIMINAL PROCEDURE — MOTION FOR RULE ON THE CLERK — NECESSITY FOR ATTORNEY TO ADMIT MISTAKE IN FAILING TO FILE TRANSCRIPT ON TIME. — Where an attorney for a defendant in a criminal case attaches an affidavit to his Motion for Rule on the Clerk, stating that the transcript was not timely filed due to a mistake on his part, the motion will be granted.
