APPEAL & ERROR — MOTION FOR RULE ON THE CLERK — LATE TENDER OF RECORD — ADMISSION OF MISTAKE BY ATTORNEY GOOD CAUSE FOR GRANTING MOTION. — An admission by an attorney for a criminal defendant that the record was tendered late due to a mistake on his part is good cause to grant a Motion for Rule on the Clerk.
