CRIMINAL PROCEDURE — POST-CONVICTION RELIEF — FAILURE TO COMMUNICATE PLEA BARGAIN — FAILURE TO FILE REQUESTED AFFIDAVIT OF PROSECUTOR — CASE REMANDED FOR HEARING. — Where petitioner claimed in part that his trial counsel failed to communicate a plea bargain offer from the prosecuting attorney, and the appellate court directed the attorney general to furnish it with an affidavit from the prosecuting attorney on the matters pertaining to plea negotiations with petitioner's attorney, which he did not file, the case was remanded to the trial court for a hearing on this issue only.
