ATTORNEY & CLIENT — MOTION TO WITHDRAW AS ATTORNEY ON DIRECT APPEAL — GRANTED. — Where appellant's attorney had resigned his position as public defender and because of heath problems was unable to represent appellant on his appeal, the supreme court granted counsel's motion to be relieved for good cause shown and named another attorney to be substituted in the matter.
