APPEAL & ERROR — MOTION FOR RULE ON THE CLERK — GOOD CAUSE FOR GRANTING. — An admission by an attorney for a criminal defendant that the record was tendered late due to a mistake on his part is good cause to grant a motion for rule on the clerk.

Motion for Rule on the Clerk; granted.

PER CURIAM. Appellant, Timothy Moses, by his attorney, Richard H. Young, has filed a motion for rule on the clerk. His attorney "excepts full responsibility for the late filing." We assume he means he "accepts" responsibility for the error.
