We amend Arkansas Supreme Court Administrative Order No. 2(b)(4) and republish it as set out below. The amendment is effective immediately. The changes are illustrated in the footnote.¹

Administrative Order Number 2. Dockets and Other Records

(b) *Judgments and Orders.*

...

(4) A judge may make any order effective immediately by signing it, noting the time and date thereon, and marking or stamping it “filed in open court” or “filed by Judge.” Any
