Petitioner's pro se third petition to reinvest jurisdiction in the trial court to consider a petition for writ of error coram nobis; motions for appointment of counsel and for oral argument. Petition dismissed; motion for appointment of counsel and motion requesting oral argument moot. Hart, J., dissents.

[CR-19-682](#). Alvin Ray Williams v. State of Arkansas, from Pulaski County Circuit Court, Sixth Division. Affirmed. Hart, J., dissents.
